- •Officers attended a meeting with the "anchor out" boat community to answer questions and build trust and open lines of communication.


TRAFFIC MONITORING

MONTHLY CASE SUMMARY

- •Officers responded to an auto burglary that occurred in the Spinnaker Restaurant parking lot. The suspect smashed out a window to steal a purse that was left in plain sight.
- •This month, officers responded to 6 thefts from unlocked vehicles. In all cases, items of value were left in plain view.
- •Officers responded to two stolen bicycle reports this month. Both bicycles were not locked at the time of the thefts.
- •Officers investigated 3 dinghy thefts. In one case, the owner recovered his dinghy. The cases are under investigation.
- •A merchant in the 700 block of Bridgeway saw a man leaving his store with two coats he had just stolen. The store owner confronted the suspect who gave them back without incident. Officers searched for the suspect but were unable to locate him.
- •Duane Jackson of Marin City was arrested for attempting to steal a bottle of rum from Mollie Stone's Market.

- •Detective Mather was assigned to the Marin County Major Crimes Task Force for two weeks.
- •Detective Mather responded to SF General Hospital to investigate a possible child molest case that was reported in Sausalito. Upon completion of the investigation there was no merit to the allegations.

- •Officers investigated an auto burglary in which the suspect later used the victim's credit cards to make several purchases.
