


PROPOSED SELF-GUIDED WALKING TOUR MAP

## SAUSALITO HISTORICAL SOCIETY 2013 SAILING WALKING TOUR

## Walking Tour Overview

The Sausalito Historical Society (SHS) is pleased to announce its latest community-produced exhibit project, Sausalito Sets Sail. Opening in early summer 2013, this interpretive wayside experience will feature a treasure trove of engaging educational elements aimed to celebrate Sausalito's rich sailing history—from historical photographs from SHS' collection to hands-on props and an authentic sailboat display.

In the early stages planning of planning, a self-guided walking tour along the Sausalito waterfront will be the heart of the exhibition. When implemented the tour will include 14 high-quality freestanding horizontal interpretive graphic panels placed temporarily along the waterfront during the summer of 2013. The installation would coincide with the heightened interest in sailing on San Francisco Bay with the 34th America's Cup races.

The installation will span from Hurricane Gulch north to Marinship Park. A freestanding interpretive graphic is planned on the Bridgeway sidewalk near Richardson Street and will highlight the story of Nunes Brothers Boatyard that once stood on nearby Swede's Beach. Another interpretive graphic is planned a short walk away near the Trident restaurant. At this location, a freestanding interpretive graphic will be installed temporarily on the sidewalk to highlight the San Francisco Yacht Club and the historic building that still stands today.

The walking tour will be designed by The Sibbett Group exhibition designers, Jessica Brainard Associates interpretive planners, and Leslie Stone Associates graphic designers—all firms based in Sausalito and volunteering their services. SHS will solicit project sponsors from Bay Area individuals and businesses to fund the self-guided walking tour.
