

As your Recreation Commission we continually see the increasing need for improved outdoor recreation spaces and we are excited by the opportunities currently available to residents to envision park master planning and the dedication of groups and individuals to improve upon our existing parks. The Friends of Dunphy Park have commenced a public information process that will ultimately lead to a re-design of the entire property. The Parks and Recreation department has a plan for Robin Sweeny Park that is shovel ready as soon as we raise the needed funds. The Lions Club completed the beautiful upgrade of Mary Ann Sears Park on Harrison Avenue and the Rotary Club is in the process of upgrading Cazneau Park. The prospect of brining all of our parks up to an appropriate standard will require large scale community support. 



Muir Beach Parking Lot Re-Opened to New Views and Restored Floodplain

After five months of construction, the Muir Beach parking lot is open to visitors once again. This fourth and final phase of a five year project to restore the lower Redwood Creek floodplain was completed in late December 2013. New paths, a picnic area, restrooms, pedestrian footbridge, and improved beach access make visiting Muir Beach nicer than ever.

When Muir Beach became part of the Golden Gate National Recreation Area in 1978, the parks inherited the terminus of Redwood Creek. Redwood Creek starts high in the hills on Mt. Tamalpais, runs through Muir Woods National Monument, and down Frank's Valley to reach Muir Beach. This quiet creek holds an "evolutionarily significant" population of coho salmon as well as steelhead trout and California red-legged frog populations, all of which are listed species. Beginning in the late 1800s, Redwood Creek watershed has been shaped by cattle grazing, timber harvest, greater numbers of roads and housing built, and creek channelization. Combined over time, these impacts have degraded the creek system. The results of this degraded system have been flooded roads and trails, fragmented and damaged habitat, and declining numbers of our listed species.

The National Park Service broke ground in 2009 on the first phase of a large scale construction project to re-align the channelized creek and re-connect it to the floodplain, create safer access to the beach and surrounding trails, and create habitat for wildlife. Between 2009 and December 2013, much work has been done to achieve these goals. Lagoons and backwater ponds were dug to absorb the heavy creek flows during large rain events. Invasive species were removed to make way for healthy native habitat. New access trails and a re-aligned coastal trail allows for safe access to the beach and other entry points to the parks. A new creek channel was created to meander through the lowest point of the floodplain. The final touch came with the last stage of construction: the parking lot was moved out of the floodplain to a location that allows floodwaters to move more naturally.

If you visit Muir Beach today, you'll notice a new pedestrian footbridge that spans the wide floodplain covered in erosion control fabric. This

footbridge clears the 100 year flood event height while fabric will hold the newly graded soils in place while the native plants establish and take root. You may see groups of volunteers planting these baby plants into the jute fabric. Around 10,000 plants are scheduled to be planted at Muir Beach this year, most of which will be done by volunteers.

When the rains finally come, we will see the fruits of these years of construction. As the creek swells, the croaking frogs, returning salmon and steelhead, and bright new native plants will welcome visitors into this special place on the edge of west Marin county. Radio Sausalito 1610 AM, Cable Channel 26, and now Streaming!

We all know that Sausalito's beautiful hills and valleys create difficult reception for cell phones and radio signals, but Sausalito's community radio station has found a way around that. Radio Sausalito recently made its programming available as an Internet audio stream on its website, <http://www.radiosausalito.org>.

Radio Sausalito broadcasts commercial-free big band, jazz and locally-oriented programming twenty-four hours a day, including information about happenings, local music, and nonprofits. The station will continue to broadcast on 1610 AM radio in Southern Marin, and the internet stream will feature the same programming in high fidelity.

In addition to making Radio Sausalito available on internet-enabled devices like PCs, Macs, tablets and smart phones, the goal of the live stream is to expand Radio Sausalito's reach to a worldwide audience. With community-produced programming like *The Field Trip*, *A Different Slant*, *Bay Birds* and *Sausalito's Secret History*, the station provides a fresh voice with a decidedly Marin perspective. Sausalito Historical Society

In 2013 the Sausalito Historical Society launched Sausalito Sets Sail the city's first self-guided walking tour along the Sausalito waterfront. To learn more about the tour, look for the introductory panels outside the Ice House at 780 Bridgeway, and the six additional waterfront panels placed from Gabrielson Park south along the waterfront. Through March 1, 2014 you may still view an associated exhibition of sailing related art and artifacts in the Society's Exhibit Room on the top floor of City Hall at 420 Litho Street. The art exhibition is open to the public Wednesdays and Saturdays, from 10am to 1pm. Admission to either installation is free.

This January, over 100 sailing enthusiasts and history buffs enjoyed a lively evening of Sausalito Salty Stories, at the beautiful Ondine, overlooking the Bay. This fundraiser for the Sausalito Sets Sail project featured notable local sailors Hank Easom, Alan Olson, Bill Martinelli, Mary Crowley and Tony Badger who shared stories of racing, cruising, and rabberousing. Surprise guests included Victoria Colella and Stuart Rabinowitsch performing an original Sausalito sea shanty; renowned yachtsman Warwick ("Commodore") Tompkin; and Tompkins' friend, legendary folksinger Ramblin' Jack Elliott. Raffle prizes included gift certificates from local supporters Salito's, Angelino's, SF Bay Adventures, The Trident, F3, Spinnaker, Massage Envy, Inn Above Tide, Hotel Sausalito and Poggio.

Initial funding for Sausalito Sets Sail came from Historical Society members and sponsors such as The Sausalito Art Festival Foundation, Casa Madrona Hotel & Spa, Inn Above Tide, Scoma's Restaurant, The Trident/Ondine, and Bert Damner of the Spaulding Wooden Boat Center. The Sausalito Public Library is located at 420 Litho Street in the City Hall building off Caledonia Street. We are open seven days a week and provide public internet stations, free Wi-Fi for laptop users, comfortable seating, and large collections of books, DVDs, CDs, audiobooks, and children's materials. Our website features our online library catalog, downloadable e-books and e-audiobooks, research databases, language instruction, museum passes, and our current adult and children's program schedules.

Library Services

REQUESTS ARE FREE

In conjunction with the other public libraries of Marin, the Sausalito Public Library is no longer charging a \$0.50 hold fee on requests for books and other items requested from other Marin libraries. No charge will be assessed whether you place the request yourself using the online catalog or ask for staff assistance. Items will be available for pick up under your name at our self-serve hold shelf.

E-BOOKS FROM THE LIBRARY

The Library offers three free collections of electronic books, featuring thousands of quality titles -- including recent bestsellers -- from major publishing houses like Random House and HarperCollins. Both e-books and e-audiobooks are available, and can be used on tablet, laptop and desktop computers, Kindles, iPads, iPhones, Android devices, and other mobile gadgets. Sausalito Police Department Marine Patrol Citizen Auxiliary Unit

Do you enjoy volunteering? Do you want to serve your community? Do you have an interest in public safety? Do you have maritime or boating experience? If you answered yes to those four questions, you may be a candidate for the Sausalito Police Department's Marine Patrol Citizen Auxiliary Unit.

The Marine Patrol Citizen Auxiliary Unit is based on the Sausalito Police Department's Volunteers in Public Safety Program, as well as other volunteer/citizen auxiliary marine units from across the nation. The Marine Patrol Citizen Auxiliary Unit's mission is to provide the Sausalito Police Department with a cadre of trained citizen volunteers to work alongside members of the department's Marine Patrol Unit. The Citizen Auxiliary Unit, along with the Marine Patrol Unit, will provide the Sausalito Police Department with more opportunities to conduct patrols along the Sausalito Waterfront, within Richardson Bay, and in other surrounding bodies of water. The members of the Citizen Auxiliary Unit will serve as both crewmembers and boat operators on the Sausalito Police Department's vessels. Citizen Auxiliary Unit members will also primarily operate the patrol vessels while the Marine Patrol officers are conducting law enforcement activities.

The Sausalito Police Department's Marine Patrol Unit was created in 2007 and its members serve on the unit as collateral duty to their normal patrol/investigative duties. The Marine Patrol Unit's resources and capabilities are dedicated to enforcing local, state, and federal maritime laws, rendering assistance in emergency and distress situations, providing security on the waterways, and maintaining the safest possible boating environment. Since the Marine Patrol Unit's creation, it has logged over

1,260 operational hours patrolling/training on the water. The Marine Patrol Unit operates two vessels, Marine One (a 26 foot dual engine Safeboat) and Marine Two (a 22-foot twin hulled Munson) which have both been involved in several rescues, arrests, and maritime safety/enforcement operations. The Marine Patrol Unit works closely with the United States Coast Guard and other law enforcement maritime units in the area.

Requirements to be a member of the Marine Patrol Citizen Auxiliary Unit:

- Be at least 21 years of age.
- No felony convictions.
- No misdemeanor convictions within the previous year.
- No misdemeanor convictions that involve moral turpitude.
- Successfully pass an oral interview with the Marine Patrol Supervisor.
- Successfully pass a physical agility/skill evaluation based on situations encountered in the maritime environment.
- Successfully pass a personal background investigation (including fingerprinting).
- Successfully pass a maritime training program (including vessel operator certification).

Sausalito Village

Sausalito Village is dedicated to providing practical assistance, social connections, and resources that enable our members to stay independent, active, and supported in their Sausalito homes and connected to the community as long as possible, as they grow older. Sausalito Village is operated by an all volunteer steering committee under the fiscal sponsorship of Community Initiatives, a California nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization, and is not affiliated with Marin Villages. A key element of membership in Sausalito Village is a telephone number that you can call to request assistance and referrals to the types of services and support you require. Most of our referrals are to a dedicated team of more than 50 volunteers, all of whom have been thoroughly vetted and passed a background check. These volunteers are available to help with transportation, take a member grocery shopping, pick up prescriptions, run an occasional errand, assist with computers and other electronic equipment, and make friendly home visits or daily or weekly phone checks. At the request of a member, trained volunteers will do a safety assessment of the member's home, make recommendations for modifications that can be taken to reduce risks, and refer the member to volunteer and/or paid service providers to accomplish these modifications. A health care advocacy group, consisting of volunteers with experience in some area of the health care field, will assist members in navigating their way through the increasingly complicated health care system to ensure that their individual needs are identified and

appropriately addressed.

When the type of assistance needed by a member goes beyond what a volunteer can reasonably offer and requires the help of a paid professional, referrals will be made to service providers whose qualifications and references have been thoroughly checked or who are personally recommended by Sausalito Village members.

In addition to the service hotline, membership opens up the opportunity to become part of a vibrant community of people who share in many social, cultural, and recreational events. Under a grant from the Sausalito Art Festival Foundation, Sausalito Village organizes and provides transportation to many cultural programs and events in the San Francisco Bay area. Recent trips have included, among others, visits to the Diebenkorn exhibit at the De Young Museum, the Di Rosa Museum in Sonoma, The Cyrus Cylinder and the Larry Ellison Collection at the Asian Art Museum, The Impressionists on the Water Exhibit at the Palace of Legion of Honor, the San Francisco Mission District Murals, and the Chabot Space and Science Center in Oakland. There are also monthly member get-togethers, monthly meetings with guest speakers, a chair yoga class, a memoir group, a weekly bocce game, a book group, volunteer recognition events, and numerous other activities.

Getting to Know Marin County's Newest Health Plan

Its focus is to provide affordable and accessible quality healthcare to seniors and to continue to look for innovative ways to serve Medicare members’ healthcare needs.




