## Recent History

### Saus-Eat-Oh Soiree:

#### A Benefit for Willow Creek Academy

On Saturday evening, March 15, costumed hosts and hostesses from the Historical Society welcomed guests at a fund raiser for the Academy in the Portuguese Hall on Caledonia Street. Throughout the school year, the Society provides third grade students of the Academy with its local history curriculum. On this night, adults got their own taste of local history when hosts and hostesses were dressed as, for example: Captain William Richardson, who was granted Rancho Sausalito in 1838 and Richardson's wife, the former Maria Antonia Martínez; Elizabeth Sperry, the wife of the first mayor of Sausalito; and Clara Lanagan, who served as president of the Sausalito Woman's Club from 1916 to 1921. To top it all off, a professional actress dressed as legendary Valhalla mistress Sally Sanford. The evening's dance topped off a day featuring a children's ice cream social, a cocktail hour with celebrity restaurateur Gary Danko and tasting time in the hall.

### The Sea Lion and the Sculptor:

#### A Book Launch & Special Exhibit

It was a full house at the Library on Friday, March 28 for the official book launch and discussion of *The Sea Lion and the Sculptor* about artist Al Sybrian, creator of Sausalito's iconic sea lion sculpture. The exhibit will remain open indefinitely on Wednesdays and Saturdays, 11:am–1:pm.

## Be a Good Neighbor: Help Each Other Prepare

Preparing for and responding to a disaster begins with first preparing yourself and your family. However, there are limits to what an individual or family can do. When a large disaster strikes and the City of Sausalito's emergency services workers are overwhelmed by calls for service, the first people you will turn to for help will be your neighbors. It is of vital importance that you build good relationships with your neighbors and help each other prepare before a disaster strikes. Here are some hints to help guide you and your neighbors in your preparedness efforts:

- Introduce yourself and get to know your neighbors individually.
- Set up a meeting with your neighbors to discuss the importance of working together to prepare for emergencies.
- Share information with your neighbors such as earthquake preparedness tips and recommended supply lists,
- Discuss and develop emergency plans with your neighbors for meeting places, methods of communication, and ways to work together in the event of a disaster. Share resource ideas for food storage items, water, first aid kits, and 72-Hour portable emergency kits. If your neighbors are willing to share personal information, collect and distribute a list with your names, addresses, phone numbers and any special needs. If possible, inventory and include on this list the skills and equipment of neighbors that could be useful in an emergency (e.g. those with medical training, those with experience regarding electrical systems, and those who own chain saws, axes, crow bars, ropes, water purifiers etc.).
- Encourage neighbors to join you in obtaining emergency training such as CPR, First Aid or Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training. You and your neighbors can get training from organizations like the Red Cross and the Southern Marin Fire Protection District.

The City of Sausalito and the Disaster Preparedness Committee encourages neighbors to work together in order to prepare for disasters. The City of Sausalito's Emergency Services Manager is available to meet with you and your neighbors to discuss the importance of disaster preparation and give advice during your organizational efforts. ## Police News: Have a Safe Summer

The summer months are here, which means travelers from near and abroad are frequently visiting the Bay Area and specifically our vacation destination known as Sausalito. The police department has received an increase in reported car burglaries from victims that parked in our Municipal parking lots downtown. This recent rash of car burglaries is not isolated to Sausalito. Many neighboring law enforcement agencies are experiencing similar problems at locations that are frequently visited by large numbers of tourists. Similar crimes have been reported at the Larkspur Ferry Landing, Vista Points (north and south side of the Golden Gate Bridge), and public parks and parking areas along the Marin Headlands.

In general, the crimes are occurring during daylight hours, on any day of the week or weekend, and the criminal(s) modus operandi is to smash a window on the vehicle to access visible bags/backpacks inside the passenger compartment. The person(s) responsible for many of the car burglaries is mainly interested in locating electronic devices such as laptops, iPads and digital cameras. But, as in any crime of opportunity, the criminals will steal anything of value.

The police department would like to remind residents and visitors alike to take the necessary precautions to secure personal property such as electronic devices and/or luggage when traveling. More specifically, if you or someone you know is planning to visit typical tourist sites and park in public parking lots, please stow your belongings in the trunk of your vehicle or somewhere out of sight. Some helpful reminders are:

- Travel light. If you don't need it, leave it at home or in your hotel room.
- Keep your wallets, purses and personal identification items (passports, etc.) with you at all times.
- If you pack a bag, carry it with you and don't leave it in the car. If you have to leave it, make sure it is secured in the trunk or out of sight.
- Be aware of your surroundings. If something or someone looks out of place or suspicious, contact the local law enforcement agency for assistance. Vigilant citizens are so important in catching criminals like these. If your instincts are sensing something is wrong, it probably is, so please make that phone call. In the City of Sausalito, for non-emergency public safety assistance, the phone number is **415-289-4170**. For emergencies dial **911**.

Traveling to new and exciting places enriches our lives and helps give us perspective. Traveling can also be a chore and to do it safely means to plan ahead and be prepared. Please take the extra time to secure personal property so you can have the peace of mind to thoroughly enjoy your vacation experience. Don't let a smashed window and stolen property ruin a great vacation!

## Emergency! Emergency! What Can We Do?

### The best way to prepare for the worst: Have a couple of good neighbors!

For years, the city has been urging residents to prepare themselves for something we all hope will never happen, but very well could. Invariably, when something goes wrong in the world (of Sausalito!)—a fire, flood, power outage, etc.—the natural reaction is to call the police or fire department and tell them to come out and make things right. A great idea! Except that the police and fire fighters may have dozens of calls before yours—all addressing the same issues.

Now, what can you do? (A better question now, than asking yourself later, what *might* you have better done to prepare?)

For years, city departments have been advising the various neighborhoods throughout the city to form volunteer emergency response groups to train and prepare for potential emergency situations. Unfortunately, the hoped for establishment of neighborhood “emergency groups” was a non-starter. Groups never developed, most likely for the following reasons:

- Neighborhood groups are too large a focus, trying to coordinate teams of volunteers who will take responsibility to manage their blocks when the worst happens is a big effort.
- Training components are difficult to manage and coordinate with busy schedules.
- The hard fact is that getting prepared for emergencies isn't a ‘real’ need in most people’s minds—at least, until ‘it’ happens.

A possible solution: While the above notion of a community or neighborhood wide volunteer association offers strong community-wide resilience, it has currently proved to be organizationally impractical. What about a “neighbor-to-neighbor” emergency program informally entered into throughout the city?

Just imagine: if there were a couple dozen two- to four-family ‘teams’—aware of the potential logistic problems that emergency/disaster situations bring, located around the city and equipped and trained to help one another?

Would you sleep better knowing that a friendly neighbor or family down the block were familiar with your property, understanding the plumbing, electrical and other utilities and equipped with a general plan for responding with mutual aid if/when the worst case actually happens? Would you feel better if—in your absence—you knew that someone else in the neighborhood knows what has to be done to protect your home if there were something going on and you couldn't be there? Wouldn't you feel better knowing that you could render the same assistance to your neighbors?

Establishing these two, three, or four family Emergency Preparedness groups throughout the city creates an efficient, non-bureaucratic and workable system for protecting your and your neighbors' homes and families—and just may build some good friendships in the process! The police and fire department look forward to working with Sausalito residents to create the “two, three, or four group system” throughout the city.

They have the experience, the equipment and the drive to work with you to make it work!

Why not discuss this idea with your friends and neighbors? The people who enjoy living in Sausalito recognize the need to help protect themselves, their neighborhoods and their community by preparing for the worst that may come, and this may just be the answer for how to do it.

## Help Food Scraps Get New Life in Sausalito

Sausalito residents are currently sending 57 tons of compostable food and yard waste to the landfill each year. Having food waste in landfills creates carbon dioxide and methane gas, both of which trap significant amounts of heat in the air. Let's reverse that trend here in Sausalito and do our share to halt global warming.

Zero Waste Marin and our partners at Bay Cities Refuse and the Sausalito Sustainability Commission want to pass along a few tips to help Sausalito residents reduce waste and help improve your garden at the same time. The key to this spring is to compost—from putting food scraps in your compost bin to using compost at home.

- **Put Food and Yard Waste in the Green Cart.** It's easy to recycle food and yard waste in Sausalito! Throw your leaves, tree trimmings, and weeds, along with your eggshells, chicken bones, and food scraps into your green cart. Food-soiled paper napkins, tea bags, coffee filters and pizza boxes can also be thrown into the green cart.

On your collection day, place your green cart at the curb. Do your part to keep the composting program thriving and successful. Please be a good neighbor and keep Sausalito pristine by retrieving your cart following your weekly collection.

With help from Bay Cities Refuse, the contents of your green cart are turned into mulch and compost to help grow your food and plants.

- **Use Compost in Your Garden.** One easy and inexpensive way to make sure your plants flourish this spring is to use compost in your garden. Compost improves your soil, allowing it to retain nutrients and moisture for your plants, making your garden healthier and more beautiful.

Spring is a great time of year for us all to begin new healthy practices at home. Together, we can work together to keep Sausalito beautiful and thriving.

Zero Waste Marin works with local city government like the Sausalito Sustainability Commission and haulers like Bay Cities Refuse to educate residents about reducing the amount of waste that goes into our local landfills. ### What does an Age-Friendly Sausalito look like?

Age Friendly Sausalito is a community where its residents feel welcome for their entire lives—with an inclusive attitude and infrastructure to accommodate the changes that aging brings.

The City's Age-Friendly Sausalito Task Force, initiated by Sausalito Village, placed on the City Council's fiscal year 2013/14 priority calendar, and created in July 2013, has been laying the groundwork to develop a strategic plan that will help move Sausalito forward as a city that works for everyone. The Task Force has followed the World Health Organization's Global Network of Age-Friendly Cities and Communities (GNAFCC) guidelines.

As an initial step, the Task Force mailed a questionnaire to adults 55 and older and the response was remarkable, a 50% return! 3500 thoughtful and insightful answers and comments are currently being analyzed and will help to shape the final plan.

With the approval of the City, the Task Force applied to join the World Health Organization Global Network of Age-Friendly Cities and Communities (GNAFCC). Why? Membership in GNAFCC provides for the exchange of ideas and best practices from other Age-Friendly communities throughout the World as well as guidance from the World Health Organization as the strategic plan is developed.

In March 2014 the good news arrived that Sausalito has become the first City in the County of Marin and the third City in the State of California to receive the World Health Organization's designation! Membership in GNAFCC begins a five year cycle of assessment, planning and implementation that will be monitored by the World Health Organization.

An Age-Friendly Sausalito is for everyone—since everyone is on this same journey (albeit at different stages) called aging!

### Sausalito Village

Sausalito Village is dedicated to enhancing the ability of our members to live independently, remaining active and integral to our community as we age. Sausalito Village is operated by a volunteer board under the fiscal sponsorship of Community Initiatives, a California nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization, and is not affiliated with Marin Villages. A key element of membership in Sausalito Village is a dedicated telephone number that you can call to request assistance and referrals to the types of services and support you require. We call this our Concierge Service. Most of our referrals are to a dedicated team of more than approximately 65 direct service volunteers, all of whom have been thoroughly vetted and passed a background check. These volunteers are available to help with transportation, take a member grocery shopping, pick up prescriptions, run an occasional errand, assist with computers and other electronic equipment, and make friendly home visits or daily or weekly phone checks. At the request of a member, trained volunteers will do a safety assessment of the member's home, make recommendations for modifications that can be taken to reduce risks, and refer the member to volunteer and/or paid service providers to accomplish these modifications. A health care advocacy group, consisting of volunteers with experience in some area of the health care field, will assist members in navigating their way through the increasingly complicated health care system to ensure that their individual needs are identified and appropriately addressed.

When the type of assistance needed by a member goes beyond what a volunteer can reasonably offer and requires the help of a paid professional, referrals will be made to service providers whose qualifications and references have been thoroughly checked or who are personally recommended by Sausalito Village members.

In addition to the Concierge Service, membership opens up the opportunity to become part of a vibrant community of people who share in many social, cultural, and recreational events. Sausalito Village organizes and provides transportation to many cultural programs and events in the San Francisco Bay Area.

There are also monthly member get-togethers, monthly meetings with guest speakers, a chair yoga class, a memoir group, a weekly bocce game, a book group, a monthly singalong, volunteer recognition events, holiday celebrations, and numerous other activities.
