As you may or may not know we entered into a new partnership with the Aquarium of the Bay located on Pier 39 just over a year ago. The new partnership is entitled Bay Model Alliance. This allows the Bay Model to accept donations and invest them back into the facility mainly the educational programs. The Aquarium is also handling our bookstore for us and have stocked some specific Bay Model Alliance items. This partnership leverages both the Bay Model and Aquarium's strengths. The Aquarium has a diverse educational staff and programs. We have already been offering some of their programs and anticipate doing more. The Bay Model also has a wonderful gallery space which we extend the use to local artists. The Sausalito Historical Society

We are a group of friends, neighbors, colleagues, local merchants, scholars, writers, artists, historians, history buffs and enthusiasts who've been keeping Sausalito's past alive since 1975. The SHS is an entirely volunteer 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that collects, and preserves art, artifacts, photographs and printed materials that document Sausalito's history; provides access to the collection for public and academic research; and develops publications and outreach programs to inspire local interest in Sausalito's history, to educate the visiting public and to enrich the community. Annual membership dues, donations, and funds raised are used for new acquisitions, maintenance of the collection and public outreach through exhibits and publications.

WHAT WE OFFER

Every year we offer several free or low-cost activities for members and non-members alike. These include but are not limited to history tours, art shows, lectures, radio shows, special events, walking tours and maps, raffles, historical displays, school programs, music, publications, workshops and much more.

FREE EXHIBITS

The Society staffs and manages the Ice House Visitor Center and Museum featuring a permanent display of local history. There is also a Gift area featuring works of art done by local artists and a selection of gift items relating to Sausalito and its history. Open from 11:30am-4pm Tuesday through Sunday. 780 Bridgeway (across from Casa Madrona).

Beginning at the Ice House, you can take our Sausalito Sets Sail walking tour with historic panels along the waterfront from the Ice House to Whaler's Cove.

The Historical Society's Exhibit Room and the Phil Frank History and Research Room are located on the top floor of City Hall. A team of dedicated Docents are available to assist and guide you. You will encounter a changing exhibit of historical significance plus an opportunity to do research through our Archives. Open Wednesdays and Saturdays from 10am-1pm. Located at 420 Litho Street.

Step back to a dramatic time in Sausalito history by touring the Historic World War II Marinsip Exhibit at the Bay Model. This display of photographs, paintings and actual artifacts from the WWII ships and yard was developed by the staff of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the SHS. Open 9am-4pm Tuesday through Saturday. 2100 Bridgeway. Bay Model Visitors Center.



Sausalito Historical Society News

SHEL SILVERSTEIN EXHIBIT

The SHS will launch an exhibit celebrating the works of the late renowned former Sausalito resident Shel Silverstein. Silverstein's diverse and remarkable body of work earned him renown as a cartoonist and illustrator, a poet, an author of popular children's books, a screenwriter, and an award-winning songwriter. The exhibit is scheduled to open May 1 at the Historical Society's Exhibit Room.



'Once there was a tree...and she loved a little boy.' begins a story beautifully written and illustrated by the gifted and versatile Shel Silverstein. Over 9 million copies of this book have been bought in the last 50 years.

VARDA EXHIBIT & BOOK LAUNCH

The SHS and Betsy Stroman will be co-sponsoring an exhibit of work by Jean Varda at the Bay Model. The Exhibit will open on June 1 and close on July 13. A minimum of approximately 25 pieces of Varda's work will be on display and is free to the public.

On Sunday, June 14 from 3-5 there will be a combined book launch party and formal art show opening. The featured book is *The Art and Life of Jean Varda* written by Sausalito author Elizabeth Leavy Stroman.

This event, like the exhibit, will be co-sponsored by Betsy and the Sausalito Historical Society and is also free.

PORTUGUESE HERITAGE WALKING TOUR PRESENTATION

The Historical Society and IDESST Hall co-hosted a talk by Mike Moyle on March 4th on the Sausalito Portuguese Heritage Walking Tour. He spoke about the project and the history of Portuguese in Sausalito that it reflects. The Guidebook is largely the work of Mike, a long-time Sausalito resident and member of both the Historical Society and the Hall.

SAUSALITO HISTORICAL SOCIETY**SCHOOLS PROGRAM EXPLORES MARINSHIP**

The on-going Sausalito Historical Society (SHS) Schools Program, now in its fifth year of bringing local history to third graders at Willow Creek Academy and Bayside Martin Luther King, Jr. Academy, teaches the history of Marinship to over 60 students annually. Following the model of two earlier curriculum units, one about Sausalito Historic Buildings and a second about Influential Individuals in the town's history, SHS docents present Marinship stories and facts in a classroom visit and during a local field trip where the students explore original Marinship Buildings and shipways.

The Marinship curriculum is rich material for the imaginations of young and old. Our lessons connect the students to this dramatic war-time effort by having them identify with one or more of the different jobs performed by the multi-racial workforce many of whom were women: machinists, crane operators, artists, electricians and welders to name a few. On the field trip, students experience some of the grandeur of the all redwood structures still in use in the Marinship area and see the historic shipways where the ships were launched.

At the end of the year, students write about a specific topic of their choice from one of the three curriculum projects and have their pictures taken with a theme related photograph. In conclusion, the students attend an awards ceremony and receive a framed document that includes their photo and their own writing.

Thanks to a generous grant from the Sausalito Library Foundation, we are now able to offer online access to digital archives of the *Sausalito News* from 1923 to 1957, bringing the total online coverage of the *Sausalito News* to 1885 to 1957. The *Sausalito News* was Sausalito's weekly newspaper until it went out of business in 1966. The archive may be searched and browsed via the California Digital Newspaper Collection, maintained by the University of California, Riverside. You can find the collection on the web at cdnc.ucr.edu, or via the Library website.

BORROW BOOKS FROM REGIONAL ACADEMIC AND PUBLIC LIBRARIES

Sausalito Library users now have access to over 10,000,000 books from more than fifty academic and public libraries in California and Nevada. The service is called LINK+ and is available free of charge to area library users. Books are delivered to the Library within seven days. LINK+ is integrated into the Library's catalog; just look for the LINK+ icon to start searching and placing requests—or ask for help at the Reference Desk.

New City Ordinance Regulates Bicycle Parking

In July of last year, the City of Sausalito passed a new municipal code ordinance to regulate bicycle parking. The hope is that this new ordinance will eliminate the numerous bicycles that were left on sidewalks and around businesses and restore some order to the downtown area. These bicycles will no longer detract from the unique experience that visitors feel when coming to Sausalito.

Sausalito is unique because of the volume of bicyclists that comes into our city on a daily basis. There has been a significant increase in San Francisco-based bicycle rental companies whose business model is to rent bicycles to tourists to ride across the Golden Gate Bridge and into Sausalito for the ferry ride back to the City. The increase in bicycle tourism has had a direct impact to our downtown area. Tourist and enthusiast riders alike both locked their bicycles to meter poles and other fixed objects. Often these bicycles were stacked three deep on meter and sign poles. This condition reduced or blocked pedestrian right-of-way and often led to accessibility issues for persons with disabilities. The appearance of multiple bicycles attached to various poles and fixed objects also reduced the downtown area's natural beauty and appeal. The establishment and enforcement of designated bicycle parking areas will improve sidewalk accessibility and the overall character

To address bicycles being left in a haphazard way in Sausalito, the

riders needed to be directed to specific areas so their bicycles can be properly secured. Toward this goal, the City of Sausalito partnered with the Marin County Bicycle Coalition to obtain grant funds from the Bay Area Air Quality Management District to purchase and install several dozen "U" shaped bike racks in the bicycle high use areas.

This new ordinance allows the City of Sausalito to designate official bicycle parking zones. These zones will be accompanied by signage explaining where to legally park a bicycle and the penalty should you choose to park your bicycle in another location. The new city ordinance applies to a specific downtown area defined as "those areas of public property within 539 and 833 Bridgeway and those public streets and public right-of-ways east of Bridgeway (Tracy Way, Bay Street, Anchor Street, and Humboldt Street) and west of Bridgeway on Princess up to 62 Princess."

This ordinance is not going to be used as a proactive policing tool where officers will be looking for violations. The purpose of this ordinance is to give Sausalito Police Officers authority to remove bicycles that are creating a hazardous situation. The ordinance allows officers to remove and seize bicycles until a small administrative fee is paid.

Sausalito Village

Sausalito Village is dedicated to enhancing the ability of our members to live independently, remaining active and integral to our community as we age. Sausalito Village is a California nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization operated by a volunteer board of directors. Visit our website at www.sausalitovillage.org.

A key element of membership in Sausalito Village is a dedicated telephone number that you can call to request assistance and referrals to the types of services and support you require. We call this our Concierge Service. Most of our referrals are to a dedicated team of more than 65 direct service volunteers, all of whom have been thoroughly vetted and passed a background check. These volunteers are available to help with transportation, take a member grocery shopping, pick up prescriptions, run an occasional errand, assist with computers and other electronic equipment, and make friendly home visits or daily or weekly phone checks. At the request of a member, trained volunteers will do a safety assessment of the member's home, make recommendations for modifications that can be taken to reduce risks, and refer the member to volunteer and/or paid service providers to accomplish these modifications. A health care advocacy group, consisting of volunteers with experience in some area of the health care field, will assist members in navigating their way through the increasingly complicated health care system to ensure that their individual needs are identified and appropriately addressed.

When the type of assistance needed by a member goes beyond what a volunteer can reasonably offer and requires the help of a paid professional, referrals will be made to service providers whose qualifications and references have been thoroughly checked or who are personally recommended by Sausalito Village members.

In addition to the Concierge Service, membership opens up the opportunity to become part of a vibrant community of people who share in many social, cultural, and recreational events. Sausalito Village organizes and provides transportation to many cultural programs and events in the San Francisco Bay Area. There are also monthly member get-togethers, monthly meetings with guest speakers, a chair yoga class, a memoir group, a weekly bocce game, a book group, a monthly singalong, volunteer recognition events, holiday celebrations, and numerous other activities.

Affordable Housing in Sausalito? Yes! Home Sharing Workshops Coming to Town

Did you know that nearly one third of Sausalito residents live alone? And many of those who live alone live in homes that have an extra bedroom. If only a small percentage of these residents rented out one extra bedroom in their home or apartment, Sausalito would experience a new influx of affordable housing.

Home Sharing provides financial assistance, as well as promoting security and companionship, especially as we age. For many seniors who are no longer able to perform some household tasks, a reduction in rent can be offered for an exchange of services such as shopping, meal preparation and driving.

The results of last year's Age Friendly survey revealed that nearly 30% of respondents are open to home sharing, especially if it means being able to remain independent in their homes. In response to this information, Age Friendly Sausalito has asked Leslie Klor, the Director of the Episcopal Senior Communities Home Sharing Program based at Whistlestop to provide a series of workshops to encourage the concept in Sausalito. Leslie provides help in finding matches, background checks, a living together agreement and mediation if required.





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
