

## Coast Guard Safe Boating Expo

You and your family & friends are invited to attend a free event featuring many exciting activities on Saturday May 16th 10am-2pm, at the Coast Guard Motor Lifeboat Station Golden Gate – 435 Murray Circle, Sausalito. The Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 12 in partnership with the Active Duty Coast Guard Unit and Flotilla 14 is hosting a kick off to National Safe Boating Week (May 16-22) to promote safe boating and build partnerships between the boating public and the first responders who work to protect them.

### Event Highlights:

- **Free life jackets** (while supplies last), provided by the California Division of Boating and Waterways, as part of the worldwide “Ready, Set, Wear It” program to encourage life jacket wearing. Dog life jacket info and demos will also be available.
- **Exciting behind-the-scene tours** of Coast Guard vessels and the Coast Guard station.
- **Friendly bomb-sniffing dogs** from the Coast Guard Maritime Safety and Security Team (MSST) will provide a demonstration of their skills.
- Boating safety seminars free presentations on boat engines, weather, marine safety and more will be conducted throughout the day inside Station Golden Gate.
- **Thrilling helicopter rescue demonstration** USCG Air Station San Francisco will send in the chopper (as long as helicopter isn’t called into live service for rescue/operations)
- **Courtesy vessel safety checks** provided by volunteer Auxiliaries on trailered boats near the public boat ramp. Bring your paddlecraft, powerboat or sailboat.
- **Environmental stewardship information** paddlecraft ID stickers, safe-boating literature, stickers and activity books for children and much more.

The SHS is an entirely volunteer 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that collects and preserves art, artifacts, photographs and printed materials that document Sausalito's history. The Historical Society's Exhibit Room and the Phil Frank History and Research Room are located on the top floor of City Hall. A team of dedicated Docents are available to assist and guide you. You will encounter a changing exhibit of historical significance plus an opportunity to do research through our Archives. The Exhibit and Research Rooms are open from 10am-1pm on Wednesdays and Saturdays, and is located at 420Litho Street. (The entrance is on the right side of the City Hall parking lot).

Step back to a dramatic time in Sausalito history by touring the Historic World War II Marinship Exhibit at the Bay Model. This display of photographs, paintings and actual artifacts from the WWII ships and yard was developed by the staff of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the SHS. The Marinship Exhibit is open from 9am-4pm on Tuesday through Saturday and is located in the Bay Model Visitors Center at 2100 Bridgeway.



## SAUSALITO HISTORICAL SOCIETY

### SCHOOLS PROGRAM EXPLORES MARINSHIP

The on-going Sausalito Historical Society (SHS) Schools Program, now in its fifth year of bringing local history to third graders at Willow Creek Academy and Bayside Martin Luther King, Jr. Academy, teaches the history of Marinship to over 60 students annually. Following the model of two earlier curriculum units, one about Sausalito Historic Buildings and a second about Influential Individuals in the town's history, SHS docents present Marinship stories and facts in a classroom visit and during a local field trip where the students explore original Marinship Buildings and shipways.

The Marinship curriculum is rich material for the imaginations of young and old. Our lessons connect the students to this dramatic war-time effort by having them identify with one or more of the different jobs performed by the multi-racial workforce many of whom were women: machinists, crane operators, artists, electricians and welders to name a few. On the field trip, students experience some of the grandeur of the all redwood structures still in use in the Marinship area and see the historic shipways where the ships were launched.

At the end of the year, students write about a specific topic of their choice from one of the three curriculum projects and have their pictures taken with a theme related photograph. In conclusion, the students attend an awards ceremony and receive a framed document that includes their photo and their own writing.

## ICE HOUSE UNDERGOING CHANGES

The "coolest" historic building in downtown Sausalito is undergoing changes in the coming months. The downtown visitors center and historic display—also known as the "Ice House", because it was where Sausalito residents in the early 1900's bought blocks of ice to refrigerate their food—is the #1 visitor attraction in Sausalito according to Trip Advisor.

The Sausalito community has joined together to fund updates to the history museum and the small front office and gift store where visitors are warmly greeted and given the full range of advice on what to see and where to shop and eat while in Sausalito. The free museum prepares them for their adventure by sharing things that we love about Sausalito: our maritime culture, rich history, and the cast of colorful and talented citizens who have lived here.

The visitor center has been reorganized and outfitted with 21st century technology. We are also rethinking the small gift shop to offer merchandise that reflects Sausalito's artistic and historic heritage. The final step will be to reconfigure the office and museum display spaces to provide a more inviting experience for residents and visitors alike.

## Riding Bicycles on Certain Sidewalks in Sausalito is Now Illegal

The City of Sausalito has taken steps to amend its Municipal Code to make it illegal to ride your bicycle on certain sidewalks in the downtown area and on the southerly portions of the City. This is partially due to the large influx of rental and tourist bicycles coming through town on any given day. Signs in multiple languages have been placed along the areas of concern requesting and encouraging cyclists to walk their bicycles on the sidewalk in those areas.

Concerned about the safety of all those attempting to enjoy the busy streets of Sausalito, the City Council established a Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee to review and provide advice related to bicycle and pedestrian issues in the City of Sausalito. The Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee reached out to the community and received input indicating concerns about bicyclists riding on the sidewalks on the southern end of Sausalito creating an unsafe and uncomfortable situation for pedestrians and citizens. Based upon the results of the outreach and other public input the Committee adopted a resolution on September 8, 2014 recommending that the City Council consider the development and passage of an ordinance to limit the use of bicycles on seemingly unsafe and overcrowded sidewalks.

This new code (Sausalito Municipal Code Chapter 15.12.030) makes it unlawful for bicycles to be ridden on sidewalks in the following locations:

1. Bridgeway, between Bay Street and Richardson Street;
2. Richardson Street;
3. Second Street;
4. South Street; and
5. Alexander Avenue to the southerly City limits.

The exceptions to this ordinance are law enforcement personnel and children under 13 years of age who are exercising due care and giving the pedestrian the right-of-way.

Violation of this Municipal Code is an infraction and shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$100 for the first violation, \$200 for the second violation, and \$500 for each additional violation within that same year.

## Sausalito Village

Sausalito Village is dedicated to enhancing the ability of our members to live independently, remaining active and integral to our community as we age. Sausalito Village is a California nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization operated by a volunteer board of directors. Visit our website at [www.sausalitovillage.org](http://www.sausalitovillage.org).

A key element of membership in Sausalito Village is a dedicated telephone number that you can call to request assistance and referrals to the types of services and support you require. We call this our Concierge Service. Most of our referrals are to a dedicated team of more than 65 direct service volunteers, all of whom have been thoroughly vetted and passed a background check. These volunteers are available to help with transportation, take a member grocery shopping, pick up prescriptions, run an occasional errand, assist with computers and other electronic equipment, and make friendly home visits or daily or weekly phone checks. At the request of a member, trained volunteers will do a safety assessment of the member's home, make recommendations for modifications that can be taken to reduce risks, and refer the member to volunteer and/or paid service providers to accomplish these modifications. A health care advocacy group, consisting of volunteers with experience in some area of the health care field, will assist members in navigating their way through the increasingly complicated health care system to ensure that their individual needs are identified and appropriately addressed.

When the type of assistance needed by a member goes beyond what a volunteer can reasonably offer and requires the help of a paid professional, referrals will be made to service providers whose qualifications and references have been thoroughly checked or who are personally recommended by Sausalito Village members.

In addition to the Concierge Service, membership opens up the opportunity to become part of a vibrant community of people who share in many social, cultural, and recreational events. Sausalito Village organizes and provides transportation to many cultural programs and events in the San Francisco Bay Area. There are also monthly member get-togethers, monthly meetings with guest speakers, a chair yoga class, a memoir group, a weekly bocce game, a book group, a monthly singalong, volunteer recognition events, holiday celebrations, and numerous other activities.

**WHAT is Sausalito Village?** Sausalito Village is a volunteer, non-profit organization dedicated to helping Sausalito residents stay engaged in their community and age comfortably in their homes.

**HOW does the Village work?** Although the heart of the Village is its volunteers and members, the Village Concierge is at the hub. One phone call to the Concierge links members to vetted and member-referred businesses, health care advocates, a volunteer for a ride to a medical appointment, and to answer questions. A full calendar of activities, events and day trips keep members active and connected. Many local merchants offer Sausalito Village members discounts.

**WHO can be a MEMBER?** Anyone who lives in Sausalito and the Floating Homes can be a member, although most members are 55 and older. Everyone can be a supporter.

**Is there a COST?** Membership is \$200 for a one or two person household. A limited number of reduced or full fee waivers are available for residents interested in joining but unable to afford the annual fee.

## CARSS

### Call A Ride for Sausalito Seniors

**WHAT is CARSS?** CARSS is a FREE transportation program that is a partnership between Age Friendly Sausalito and Sausalito Village. CARSS will begin in May 2015.

**WHO is eligible to be a CARSS rider?** Residents of Sausalito and the Floating Homes (as far North as Gate 6-1/2 ) who are 60 years and older or disabled. Call for an application.

**WHO will drive?** Vetted and trained volunteer drivers will provide rides in their own vehicles. Drivers must be at least 21 years of age.

**WHERE can riders go?** Rides are available within the borders of the City of Sausalito and the Floating Homes up to Gate 6-1/2 only for any purpose.

**WHEN can riders call?** Riders can call the day before to reserve a ride or call during hours of operation to get a same day short notice ride.

**WHAT are the HOURS OF OPERATION?** During the first few months, rides will be available between the hours of 10am and 2pm Monday through Friday. As more volunteers become available, the hours will expand.

**CAN I VOLUNTEER?** YES! Volunteers are always needed, especially individuals interested in driving. Volunteer Drivers will be asked to sign up for one 4 hour shift (10am-2pm) per week or month. Drivers will receive training, and background checks will be required (cost covered by the program).
