Hi Melinda,

Thank you for the call last Thursday to clarify the issues below. I would like to make sure that I understood you correctly on the phone:

1. Can a city still use the 2000 Census data or must the city use the 2010 Census data for all estimates?

Your answer: We should be using the 2000 Census data supplemented with the most recent more specific data available (i.e. from DOF or information from a recent American Community Survey). We should use 2000 Census data for sections related to overpayment, overcrowding, etc.

2. Will a city be restricted on taking credit for units constructed prior to the 2010 Census?

Your answer: For the 1999-2006 RHNA we can take credit for units constructed during the 1999-2006 planning period. For the 2007-2014 RHNA we can take credit for units constructed from 2007-present.
