Alex Leviton: The Secret Life of a Travel Guidebook Author


Alex Leviton -- travel writer and editor, coach and consultant, and Lonely Planet guidebook author since 2002 -- will discuss the secret life of a travel guidebook author: the good, the bad, and the unexpected. Alex wrote her first Lonely Planet chapter (on Slovenia) while getting a masters degree in journalism from UC Berkeley. She went on to write for over a dozen titles, including *Italy, Tuscany & Umbria*, *The Caribbean Islands*, *Trips: The South*, and most recently, *Calm* (2013) and *Happy* (2012). Alex is also the co-author of the Umbria Slow travel guide app for Sutro Media. Her blog is online at likeahouse.me, where her coaching motto is 'You know that thing you've always wanted to do? You should do it.' Alex lives on a houseboat in Sausalito.

Stephen Olsson: Global Spirit

Stephen Olsson is the president of Sausalito-based Cultural & Educational Media, a non-profit organization that produces films and TV series designed to create understanding and respect among different peoples, cultures, and faiths. Stephen's work has received national Emmy, Dupont and Peabody awards. In his talk, Stephen will present segments from his current work, including *Global Spirit*, a TV and web series on world religions, spirituality, and human consciousness now airing on Link TV and PBS; *Bridge to Iran* (BridgeToIran.org), a window on Iranian culture for U.S. audiences; and *One Through Love* (OneThroughLove.org), a project focusing on the poetry of 13th century mystic Jalaluddin Rumi. Stephen has lived in Sausalito for many years, aboard the ferryboat *Vallejo* from 1986-1990 and over 20 years aboard *La Jota*, a wooden yacht built in 1921. More on Stephen at CEMproductions.org

Joe Tate: Adventures with the Redlegs

Joe Tate is the former leader of the Redlegs, a pirate rock n' roll band that formed in the houseboat colony of Sausalito during the late sixties. Joe's talk will focus on his adventures and tribulations in the sixties and seventies with the Redlegs. He'll also share his perspective on the houseboat wars. Today, Joe works as an electrical engineer for Umevoice Inc. of Novato, a manufacturer of noise canceling headsets for use with cell phones. Joe holds a number of patents related to this work. He also performs regularly at Sausalito's No Name Bar.

Marianne Dolan: Houseboat Wars

Local filmmaker and Galilee Harbor resident Marianne Dolan will present stories of Sausalito's citizen activists that she discovered while doing research for her documentary film, *Houseboat Wars*. How did it come to pass that one of the first sights one sees when driving into town is an open vista across the water to the San Francisco skyline instead of a canyon of apartment buildings? What was that Sea Ranch house doing on the Schoonmaker bluffs? What happened the night the moon fell into the Bay? Since moving to Sausalito in 1987, Marianne has edited documentaries -- one of which was nominated for an Emmy -- and produced and directed a syndicated environmental series. Marc and Doreen Gounard: Circumnavigators

In 1994, Marc and Doreen Gounard finished building *Imani*, a Simpson 10.2-meter catamaran, and brought her to Sausalito's Galilee Harbor. In 1996 Marc and Doreen stepped the mast, completed the rigging and took the family -- two kids three and nine years old -- to Mexico and back for *Imani's* maiden voyage. In the winters of 1997 and 1998, the family sailed to and from Mexico to prepare for the next challenge: a four-and-a-half year, thirty-eight country, west-about circumnavigation, traversing both Suez and Panama Canals. Marc and Doreen will share stories from their voyage and lessons learned homeschooling the children and navigating through difficult political waters. The Gounard family and *Imani* have been back in Galilee Harbor since 2004.

Barry Brukoff: Photographing Ruins

Photographer and Sausalito resident Barry Brukoff grew up in Chicago and studied painting, sculpture and design at the Chicago Art Institute. A visit to the temples of Cambodia prior to the Pol Pot War instilled in him a lifelong fascination with archaeological ruins. His most recent books are *Royal Cities of the Ancient Maya* with text by Professor Michael D. Coe (2012) and *Temples of Cambodia* with text by Helen Ibbitson Jessup (2011). Both titles were published by the Vendome Press. In his multimedia talk, Barry will discuss the creation of these two works and the process of putting them together for publication. David Wronski: Tor des Geants

Ultrarunner David Wronski returns to Sausalito People with a report on his experiences at this year's Tor des Geants, a 200-mile, non-stop footrace through the Alps in Italy, France, and Switzerland. The 2013 race takes place from September 9 through 16. David hopes to complete the circuit in under 100 hours, with as little sleep as possible. One of a handful of Americans selected to compete in the 2013 Tor des Geants, David has previously completed non-stop runs of 135 miles, 140 miles, and 168 miles. More at helpdavidrun.com.
