1	<b>ACTION:</b> After considerable discussion, the recommendation was to seek the highest
2	priority possible for two items "above the line" on the City Council's Prioritized Project
3	List for 2013-2014:
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1. Marinship Specific Plan – Review and update

7 8 2. Implement the Recommendations of the Community and Economic Development Study

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These two action items of priority represent prior items 31 and 33/34 (combined). As a byproduct of this discussion on priorities, the BAC determined that an additional follow-up on to the Sausalito Strategic Asset Planning report (second Eyler report) is desirable. This study will take the results of the latter report, recommending support for those "business clusters" with the greatest multiplier effect, and determine the overall economic benefits to be derived therefrom.

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**ACTION:** A subcommittee comprised of Withy, Krivatsy and Francis as staff will develop a Scope of Work for this project for review by the BAC on April 18 and presentation to the City Council on April 23. A funding allocation of up to \$15,000 will be requested.

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Further discussion lead to the best approach to funding an "economic development function". It was decided that this is not a project for the priority list, but rather a budget request item to be addressed at a later date.

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**ACTION:** The BAC will develop a rationale for this function to be submitted to the City Council on or before the May 21 meeting.

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## 6. Progress Report – Marin Economic Forum (MEF) Work

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Eckhart reported on the status of the Sausalito Strategic Asset Planning report (second Eyler report). As of March 20, Dr. Eyler anticipates completing the draft in approximately two weeks. It will be submitted to the BAC's MEF Subcommittee for review and then to the BAC at its April 18 meeting.

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Charlie Francis shared with the BAC a series of charts that have been provided to Dr. Eyler showing the sales tax generated by Marinship businesses.
