

Where's Waldo? The North End of Sausalito, Then and Now

Sausalito residents **Mike Moyle** and **Larry Clinton** will take us on a fascinating trip through the north end of Sausalito in time and space. With aerial photos, stills and video, Larry and Mike will capture a changing town from Sausalito's early days to the present. Themes will include the old rail yards at the base of Spring Street, Pine Point (which was dynamited during World War II for use as landfill for the Marinship shipyards), Whiskey Springs (site of the American Distilling Co.'s distillery until it was destroyed by fire in the 1960s), and the Waldo community, which was supplanted by the Marinship housing project which later became Marin City.

In his talk, Neal will tell the story of growing the brand from a local gem to a national treasure by being innovative, philanthropic and authentic. And yes, ice cream will be served.

Bill Broder: Two Novels

Sausalito author **Bill Broder** will read from his two latest novels: *Belief: A Novel* and *Six Hands Clapping*. A contemporary tale, *Belief: A Novel*, portrays a man whose search for God infuriates his family and friends. *Six Hands Clapping* is a unique American family story depicting the recent rise of Zen Buddhism in the United States. It is a tale of love, utopian religious ideals, and human frailty that has been repeated in different forms on this continent since the landing of the Pilgrims at Plymouth. These two novels, as well as the other publications of The Ainslie Street Project, will be on sale after the event. Half of the proceeds will be donated to the Friends of the Sausalito Library.
