

**SUPPLEMENT TO 50 YEAR REVIEW OF 112 Marion**  
**BY THE SAUSALITO HISTORIC LANDMARKS BOARDS**

**July 28, 2016**

At the request of the Sausalito Planning Commission, the Sausalito Historic Landmarks Board reviewed the prior 50 Year Review completed in February 2016. In addition, the HLB members inspected and photographed the 112 Marion residence. Finally HLB members reviewed the following documents and noted the attached findings pertinent to the 50 Year Review of 112 Marion.

1. UC Berkeley document entitled " International Longshoreman's and Warehouseman's Union Oral History Series"

.Thiis 356 page docuiment has only one brief 3 sentence reference to Bjorn Halling on Page 301 stating that he had been ILWU's legislative representative in Washington DC at an early point his career, but came back to work subsequently as a longshoreman.

2. Statement by Gary Jessen, property manager of 112 Marion for several decades and friend of Bjorn and Nikki Halling.

-This statement indicated that Bjorn Halling first occupied 112 Marion after he married his second wife, Nikki , who owned the house. Bjorn Halling first occupied 112 Marion after he retired and long after the period when he had been active in the ILWU.

-This statement also indicated the Theodore Bernardi (of Wurster, Bernardi and Emmons) did not work on 112 Marion. Bernardi and his firm had previously worked on 213 North St when this house was occupied by Bjorn Halling and his first wife.

3. Copies of invoices from Wurster, Bernardi and Emmons for work performed on 213 North St.

-These invoices document work done by Wurster , Bernardi and Emmons on 213 North St.

-There are no invoices for any work done on 112 Marion by Wurster Bernardi and Emmons.
